Recently released data out of Canada mirrors conclusions from similar studies in our country relative to youth consumption rates and stoned driving activity after legalization of cannabis. NO change. The fears of anti-cannabis crusaders are simply not manifesting, but those fears still dominate our city council, at the cost of added revenue.

We need more BIG MONEY from weed sales, but persistently pessimistic members Largaespada and Strawbridge continue to hold the line on their unsubstantiated views about weed stores. The community is getting hammered again with increased water rates because our city needs more money, not protection from more weed stores.

I fully expect the 2022 elections to seat a more cannabis friendly majority, especially since we will be counting the BIG MONEY of retail sales next election cycle. This council has been provided evidence of small cities and towns cashing in big time from selling weed. NO jurisdiction in our nation has regretted regulated activity.

Mayor Young and Vice Mayor Campbell have achieved notoriety among Solano County cities, are featured in greater Bay Area media reports, and will long be remembered for their leadership in possibly the worst health emergency in the history of our city. The most vulnerable among us, namely youth, seniors, and those with compromised immune systems must be protected. Those that refuse to be vaccinated or wear a face covering must be protected as well.
